



Alternative Fifth-Year Family & Consumer Sciences Secondary Education Program

■ About Our Program

The Alternative Fifth-Year Family & Consumer Sciences Secondary Education Program is for those who have earned a bachelor's degree in Biology, Chemistry, English/Language Arts, Family and Consumer Science, General Science, History, Mathematics, or Social Science and seek advanced certification (Class A) to teach at the high school level (grades 7-12) and a master's degree.

■ Admission Requirements

Phase I - Pre-Professional Study/Pre-Master's Study

- MAT score of at least 388 or GRE score of at least 850
- Formal, written application for graduate study (including all official transcripts for undergraduate and graduate work) by 7/15 for fall cohort, 11/15 for spring cohort, and 4/1 for May/Summer cohort
- 2.5 GPA on all undergraduate and graduate work attempted
- 2.5 in all teaching field courses, with at least a C in all courses
- Completion of general studies component: at least one course with a grade of at least C in each of the areas of humanities, social sciences, mathematics, and sciences
- Completion of bachelor's degree from regionally accredited college/university
- Completion of computer literacy course or its equivalent
- Fingerprint background clearance from ALSDE.

Phase II - Professional Study/Formal Master's Study

- Successful completion of the Alabama Prospective Teachers Test (APTT)
- 2.75 GPA on Phase I coursework and 3.0 on teaching field coursework
- Successful completion of team interview
- Unconditional admission to graduate study
- Successful completion of Phase I expectations

Phase III - Continued Professional Study

- Successful completion of the PRAXIS II exam
- Eligibility for internship & TB screening
- 3.0 GPA on all program coursework completed, professional and teaching field
- Successful completion of Phase II and Management (ED 518) expectations

Students may take up to 12 hours of graduate teaching field courses prior to Phase I as non-degree seeking students as long as the 3.0 cumulative GPA average is maintained.

■ Completion Requirements

In addition to meeting the above requirements, students must complete a LiveText online portfolio. Other departmental requirements may exist. Please check with your advisor.
