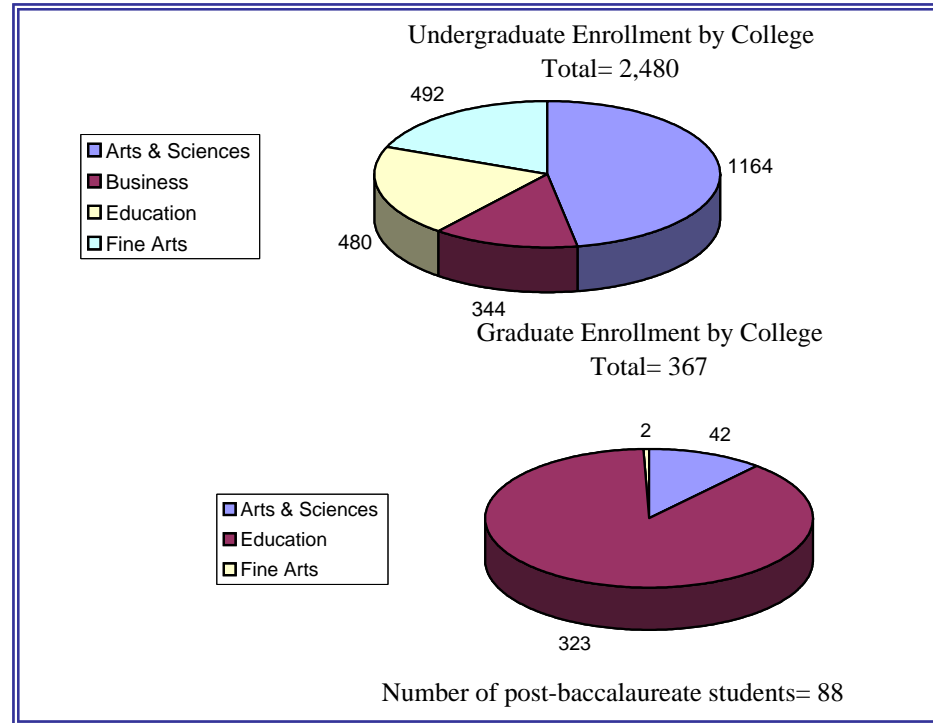

Some of the information on the 2002 Freshman Class was extracted from the 2002 CIRP Assessment Summary, a survey which is administered to new freshmen at UM and, therefore the summary contains self-reported information. The Completions Report and the Credit Hour Report were extracted from reports prepared for other agencies (IPEDS, ACHE). Housing and Residence Life and Carmichael Library supplied specific information about their areas and personnel.

The document represents the thinking and efforts of every staff member in the Office; however, Stephen Fancher, Assistant Director for Institutional Research, Planning and Assessment, managed the project, creating most of the graphics and gathering a large part of the data. He was assisted by Martha Davis, Statistical Assistant, who worked with formats and data entry. We hope you will find this document both informative and useful.

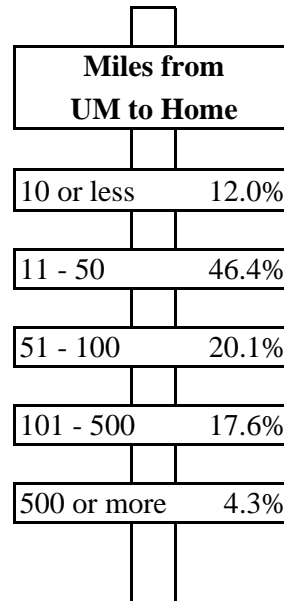

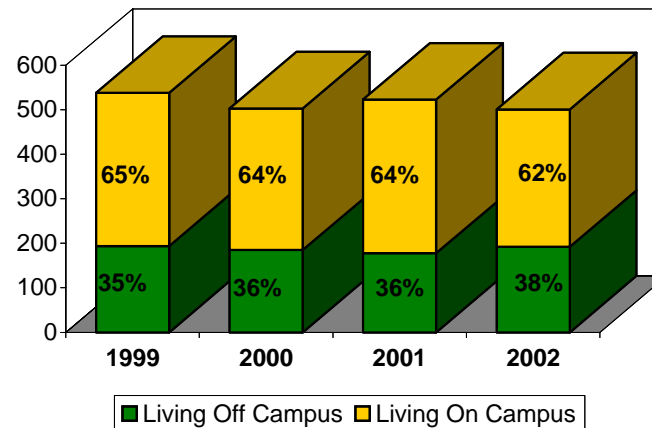

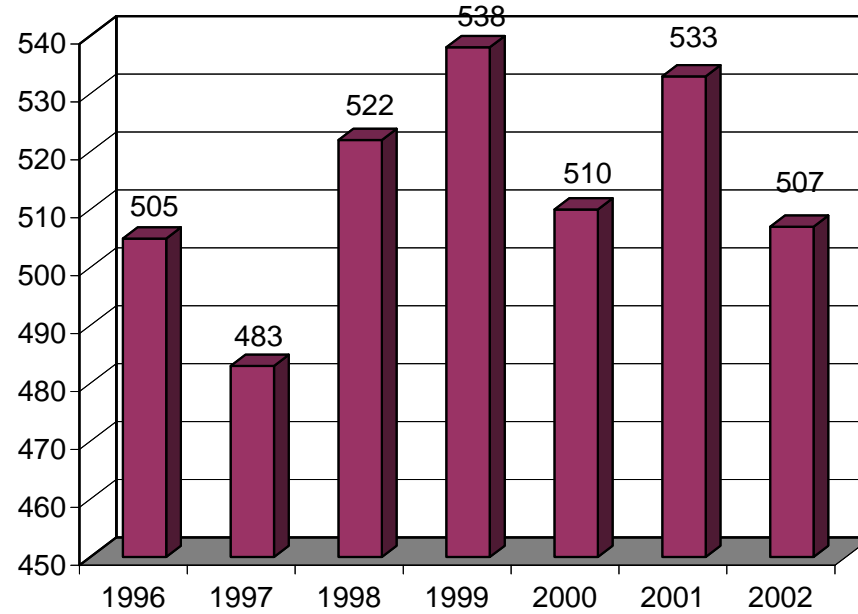

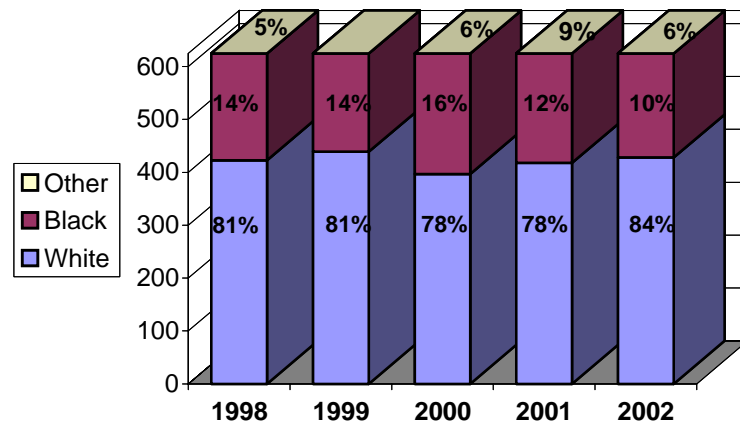


Freshman Class Size

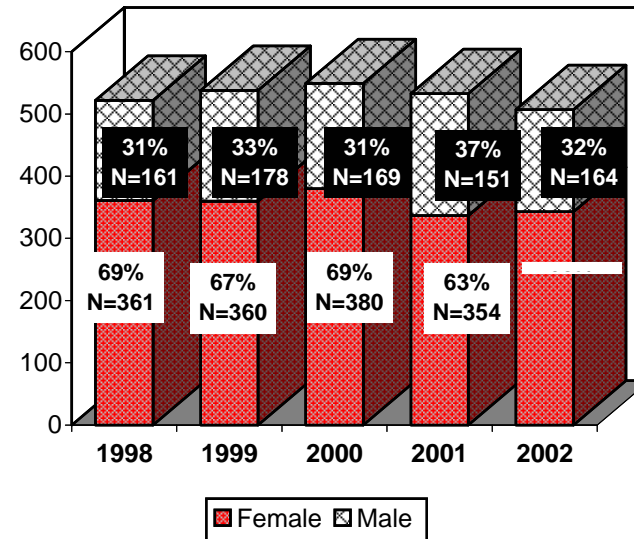
A Comparison



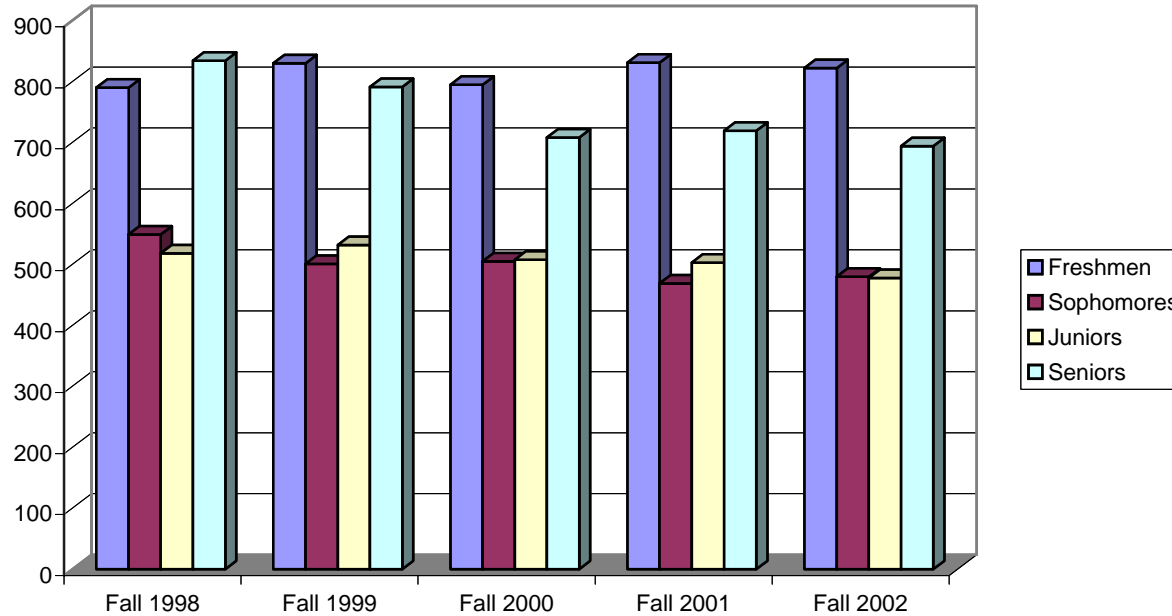
Ethnic Composition

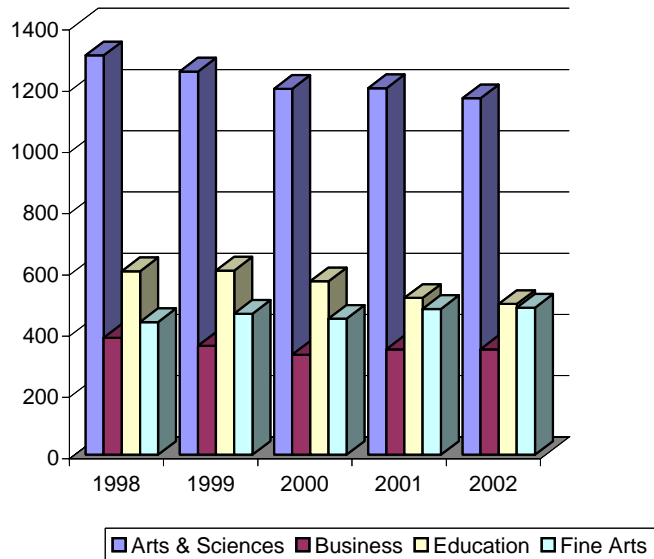

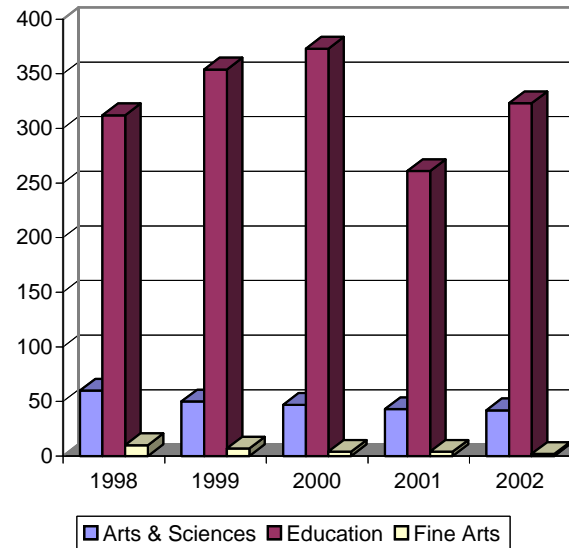

GRADUATE MAJORS BY COLLEGE



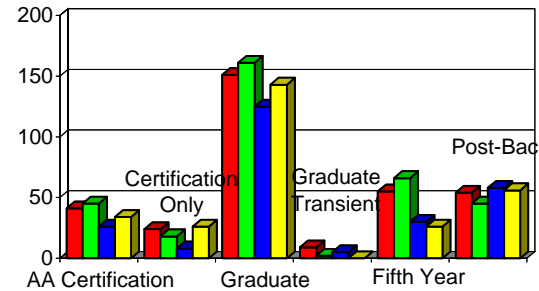

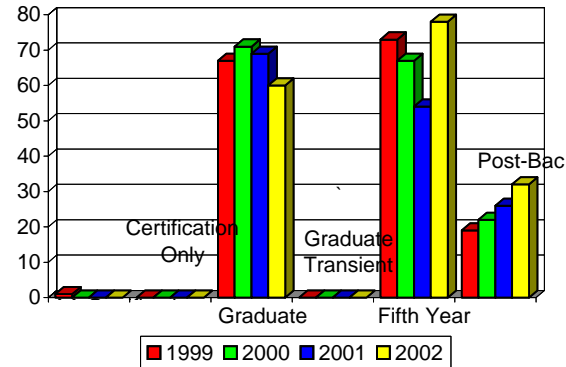

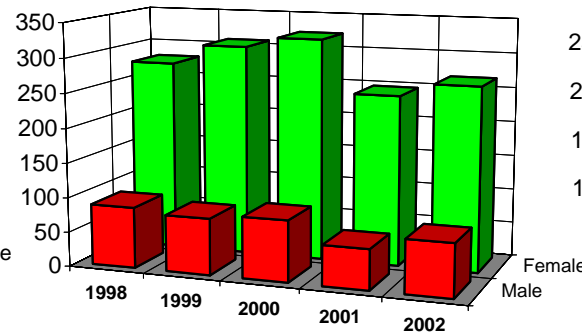
Five Year Comparison

(Degree-Seeking Students)

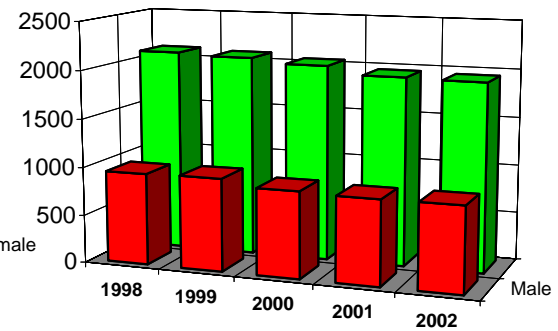

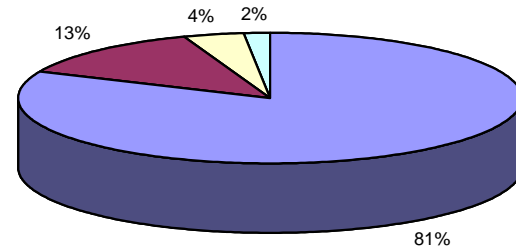

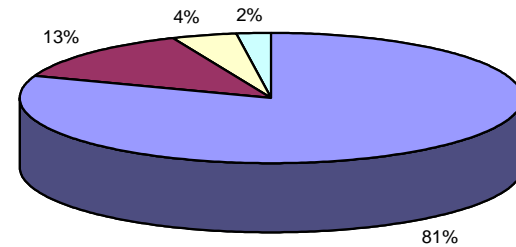
Ethnicity of all UM Students

Ethnicity of UG Degree-Seeking Students

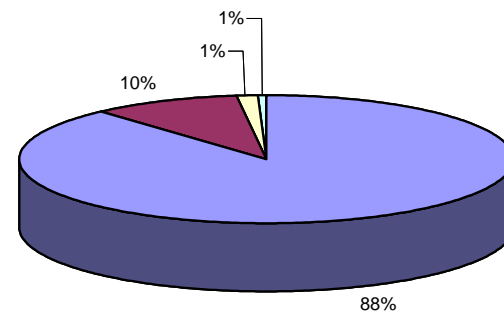

Ethnicity of Graduate Degree-Seeking Students

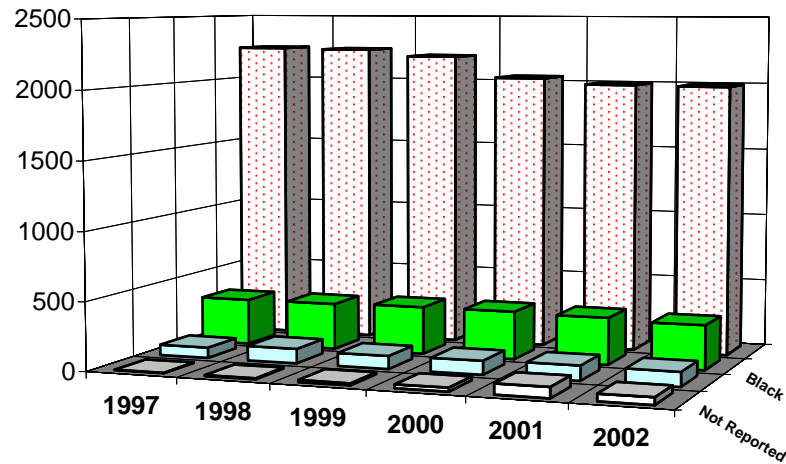

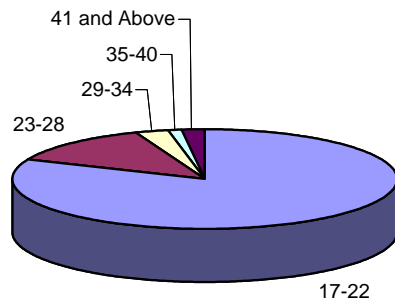

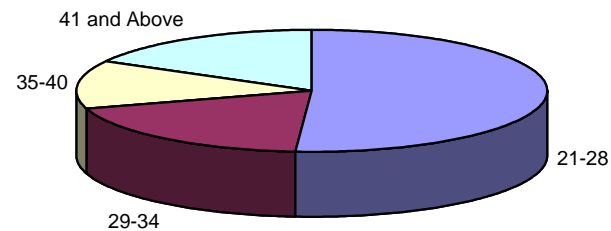

DISTRIBUTION

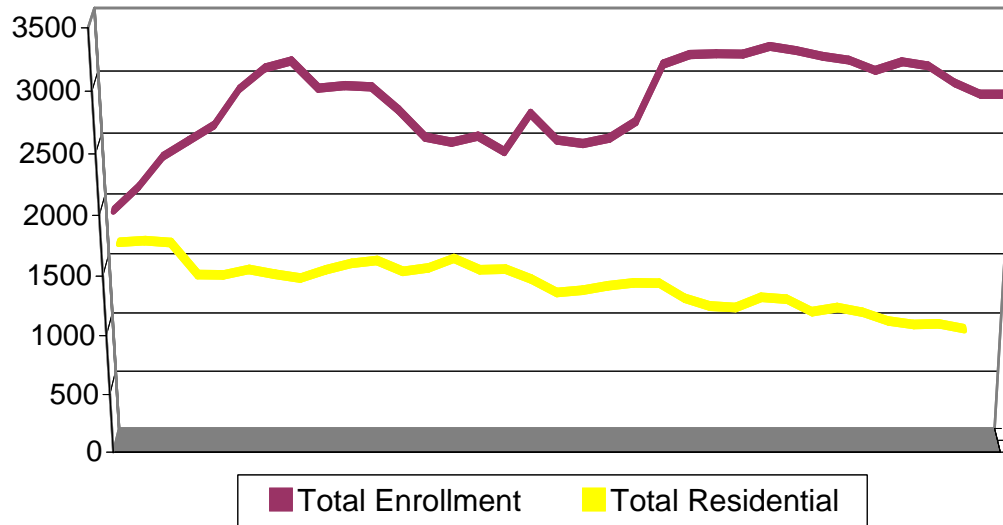

Total Enrollment vs. Total Residential

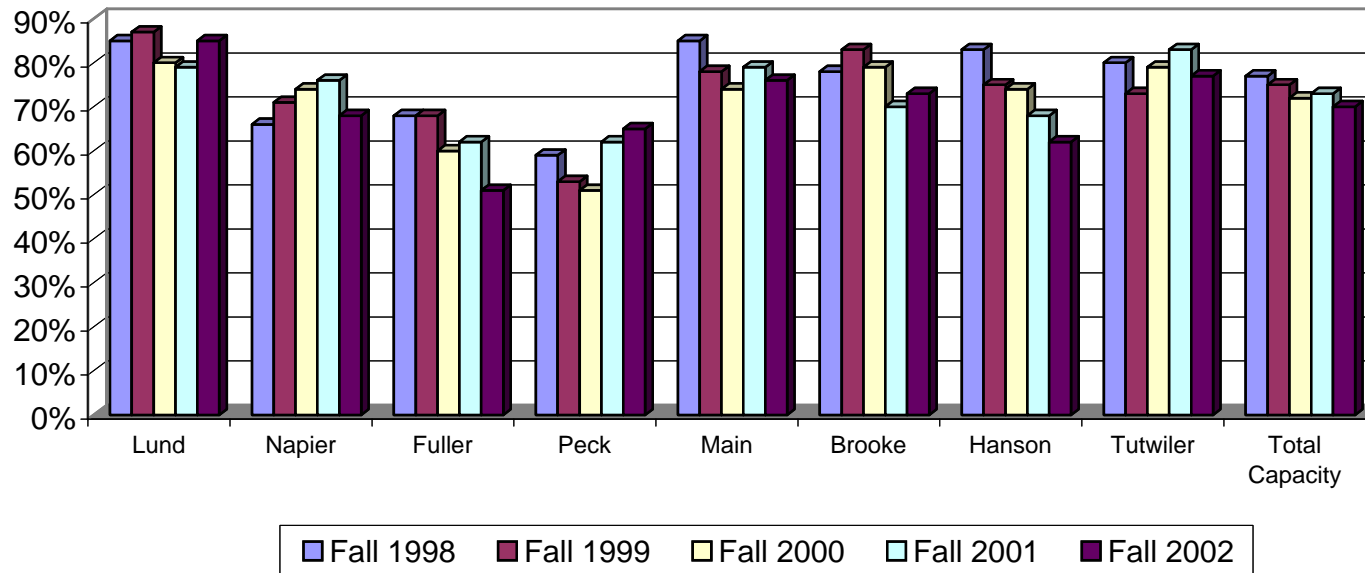

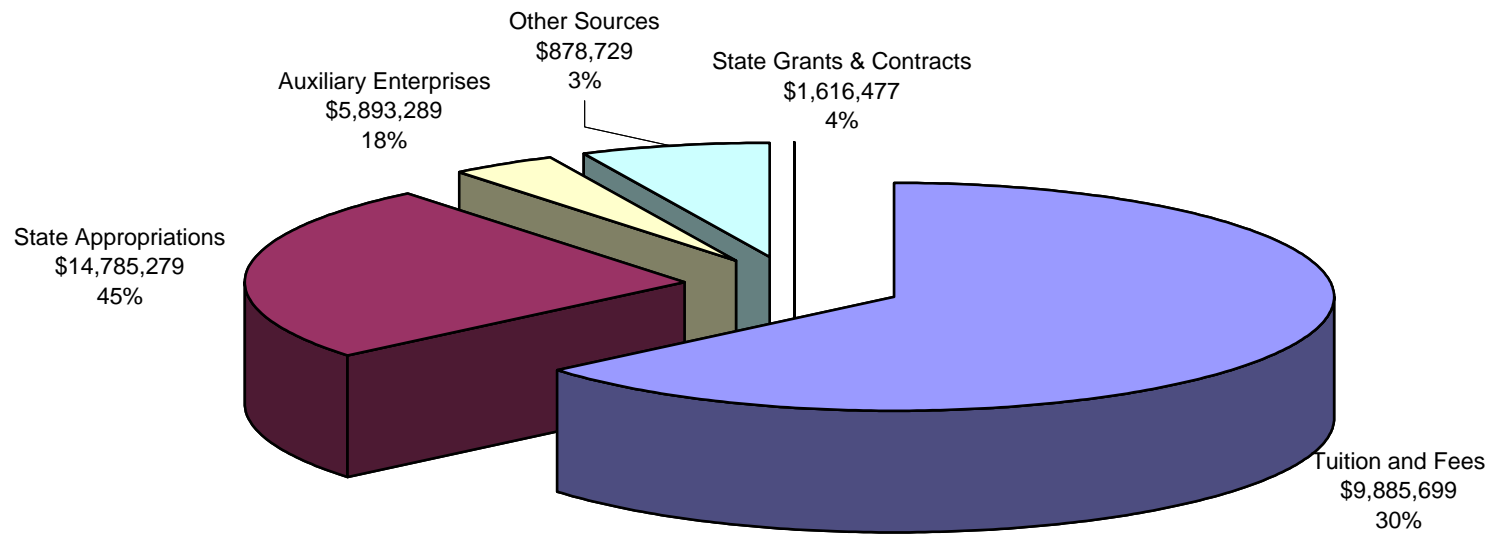
