The document represents the thinking and efforts of every staff member in the Office of Institutional Research, Planning and Assessment. We hope you will find this document both informative and useful.

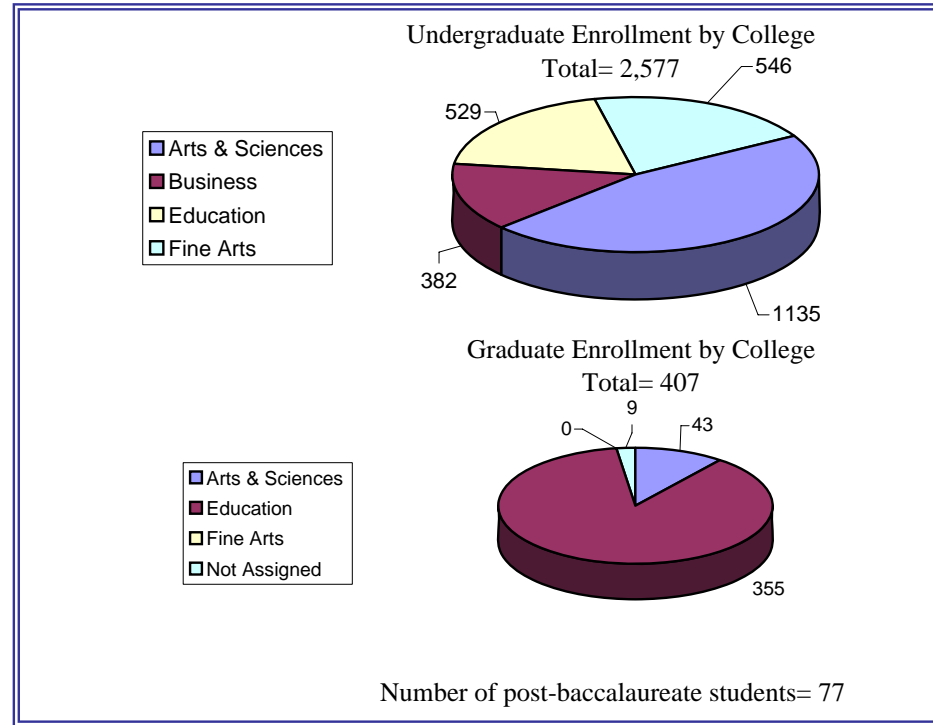
## **About the cover:**

This year's Fact Book features a photo of UM's new Student Activity Center, known as the SAC. The 90,000 square foot facility first opened its doors for the Fall 2004 semester. 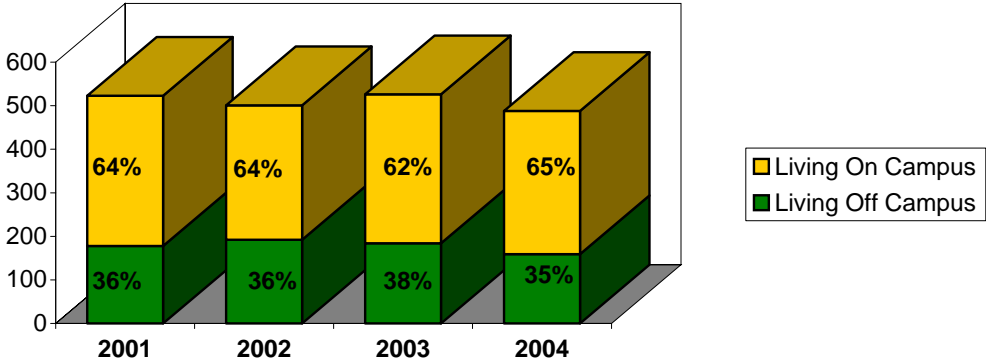

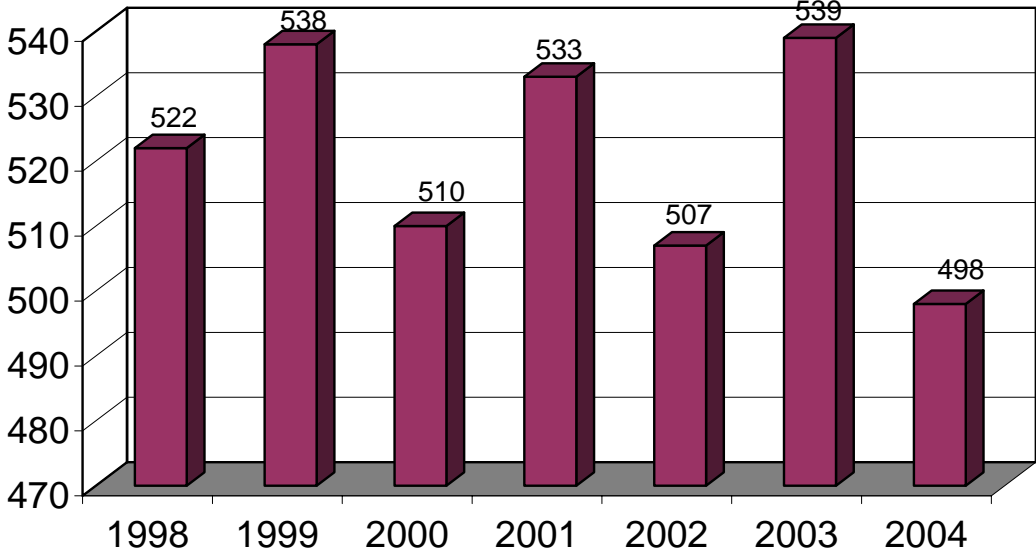

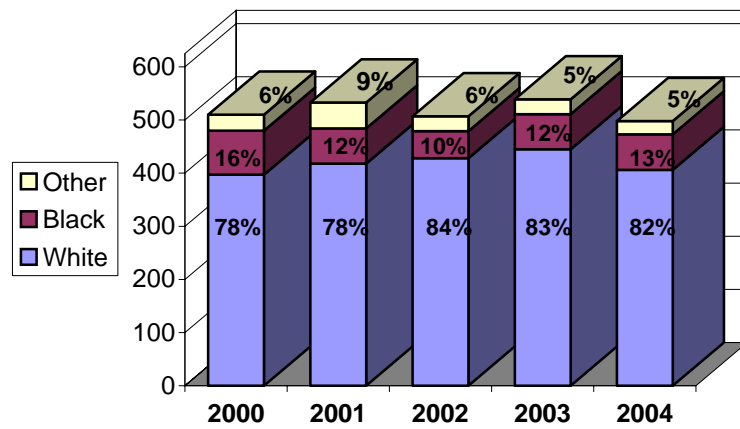


# Freshman Class Size A Comparison

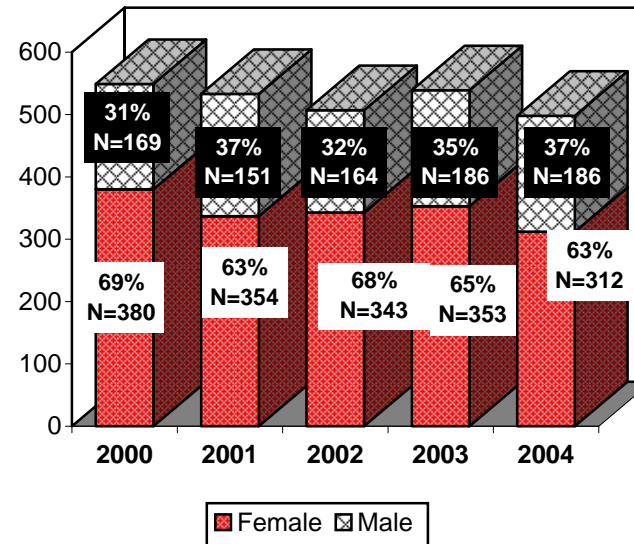


Fall 2004 Freshman Profile

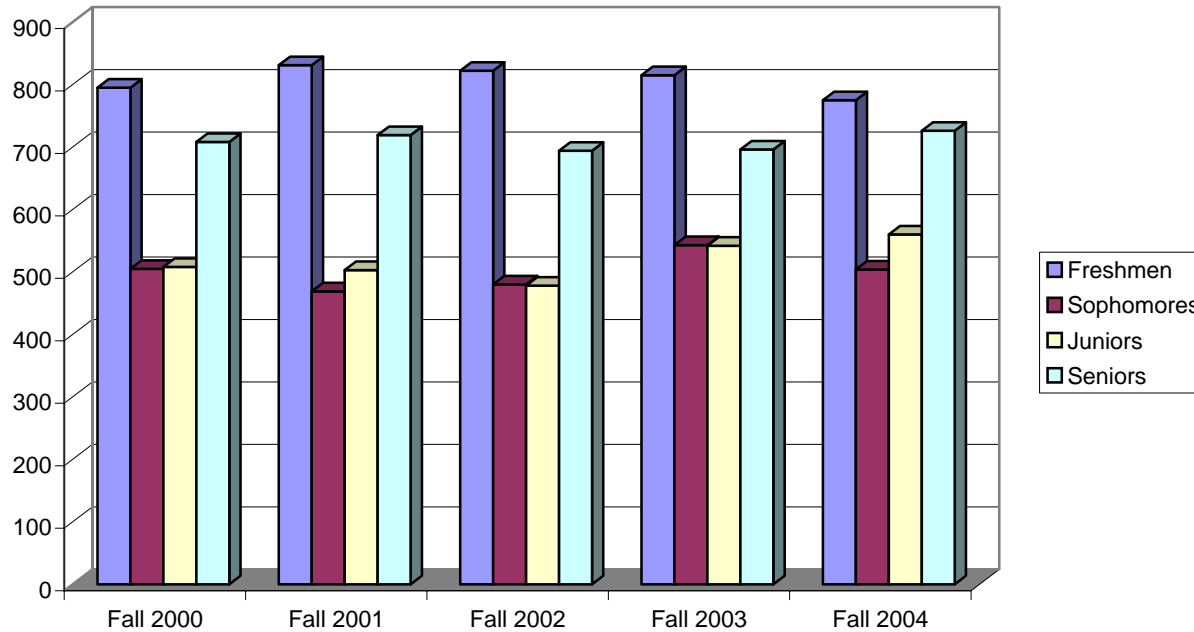
### Ethnic Composition

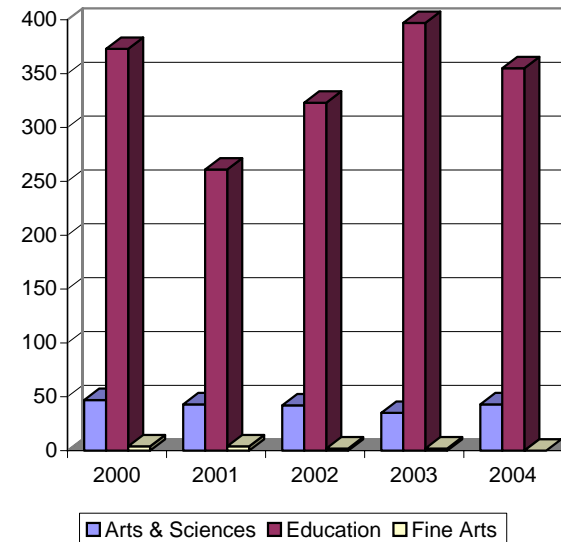

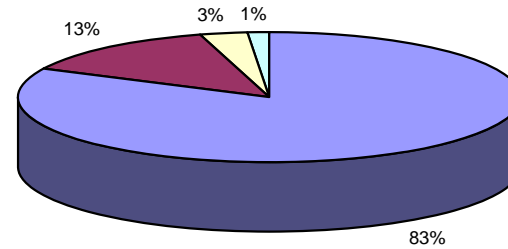

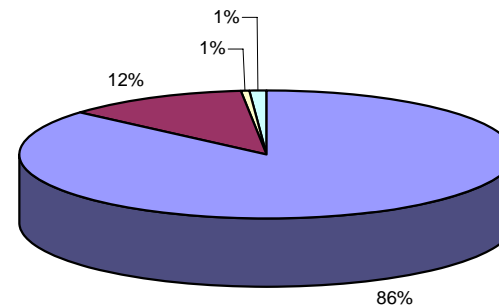

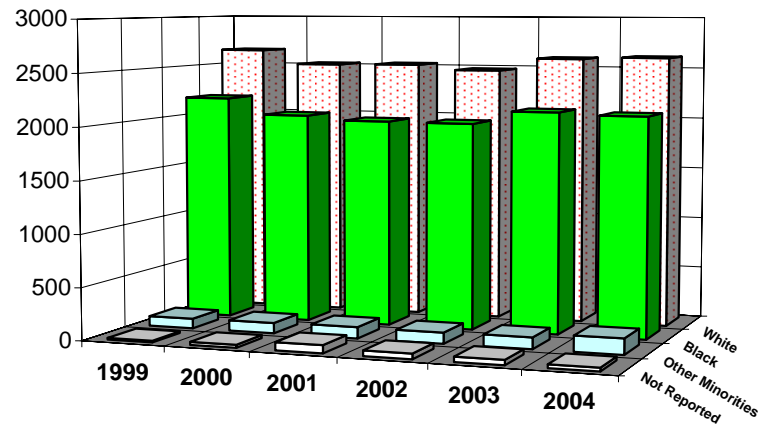

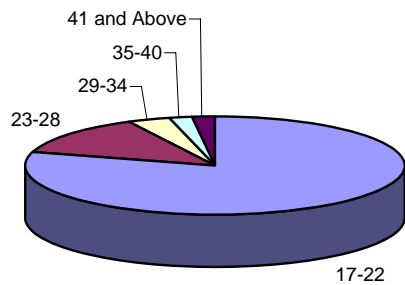

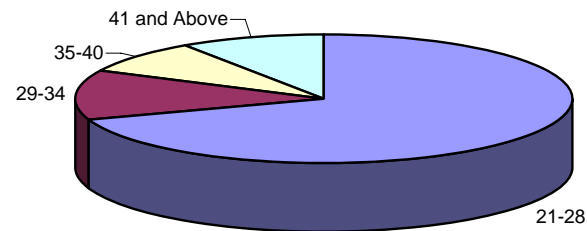

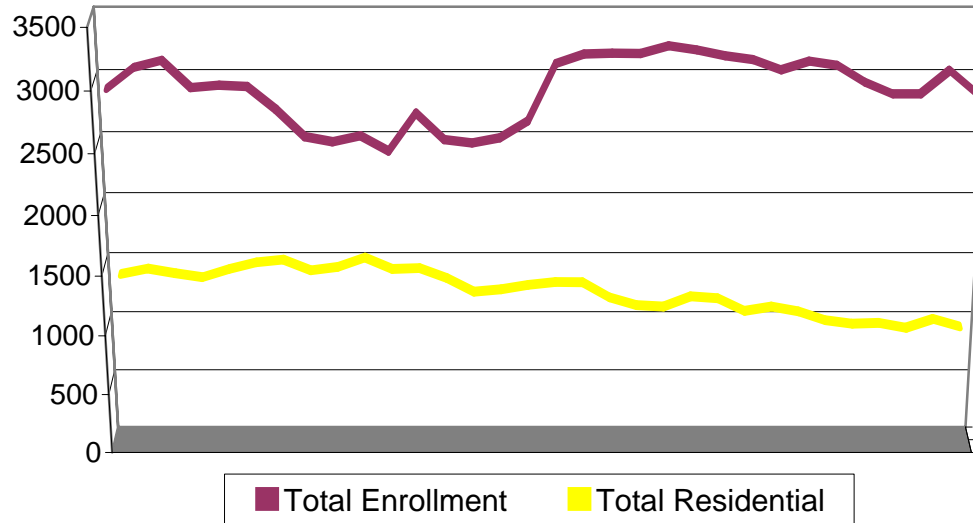

## Total Enrollment vs. Total Residential

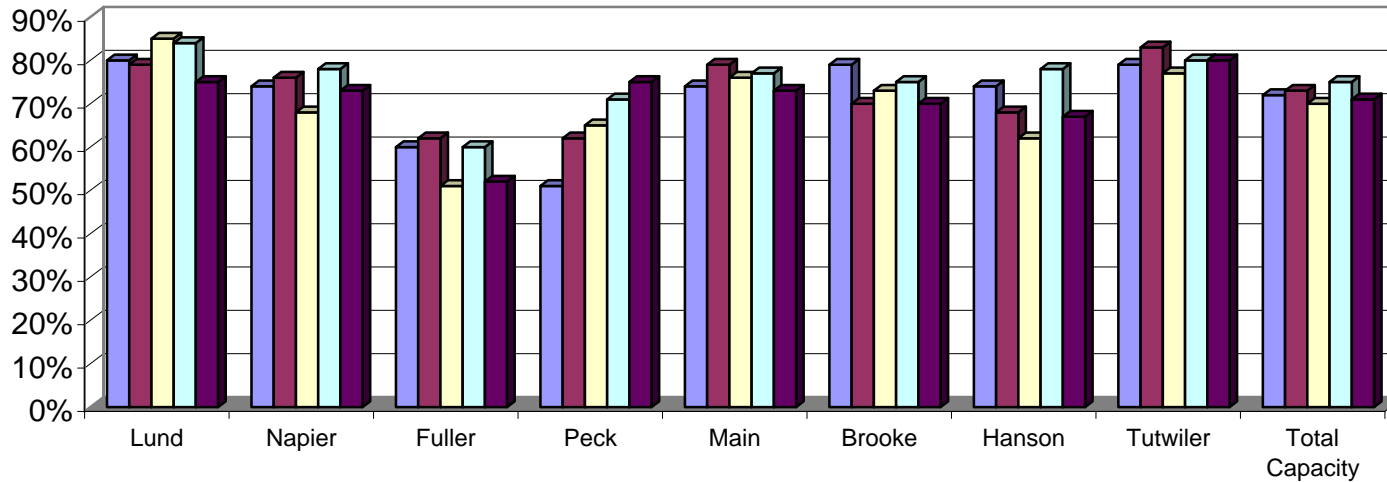

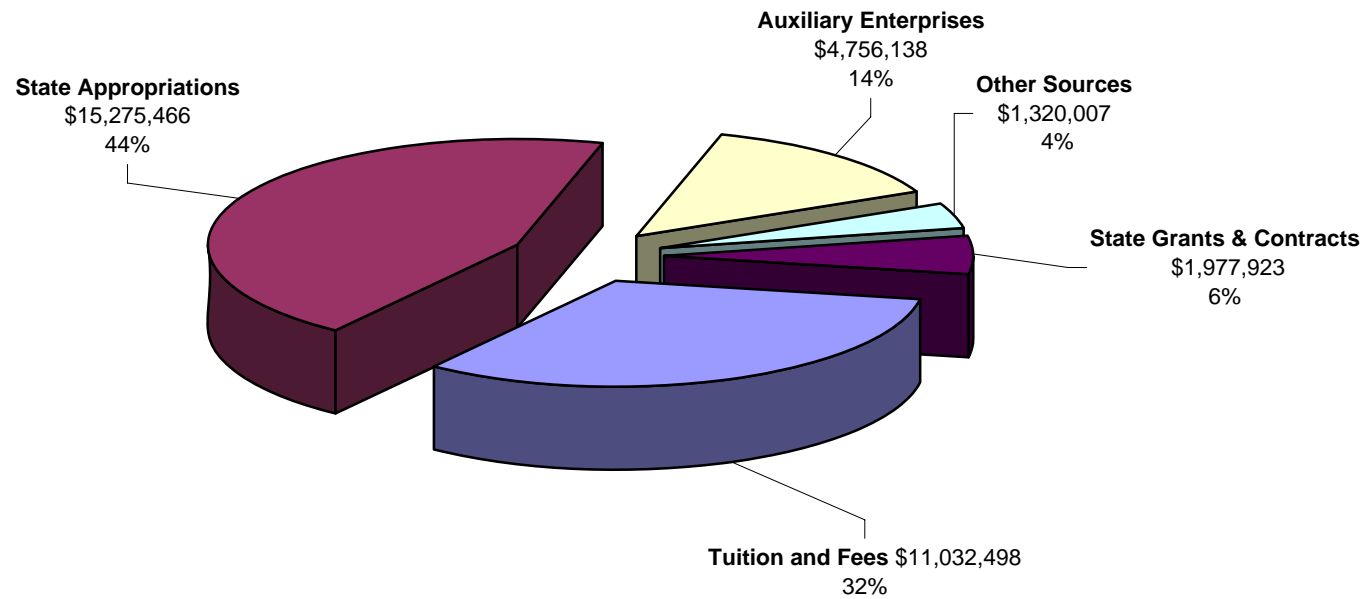
