About the cover:

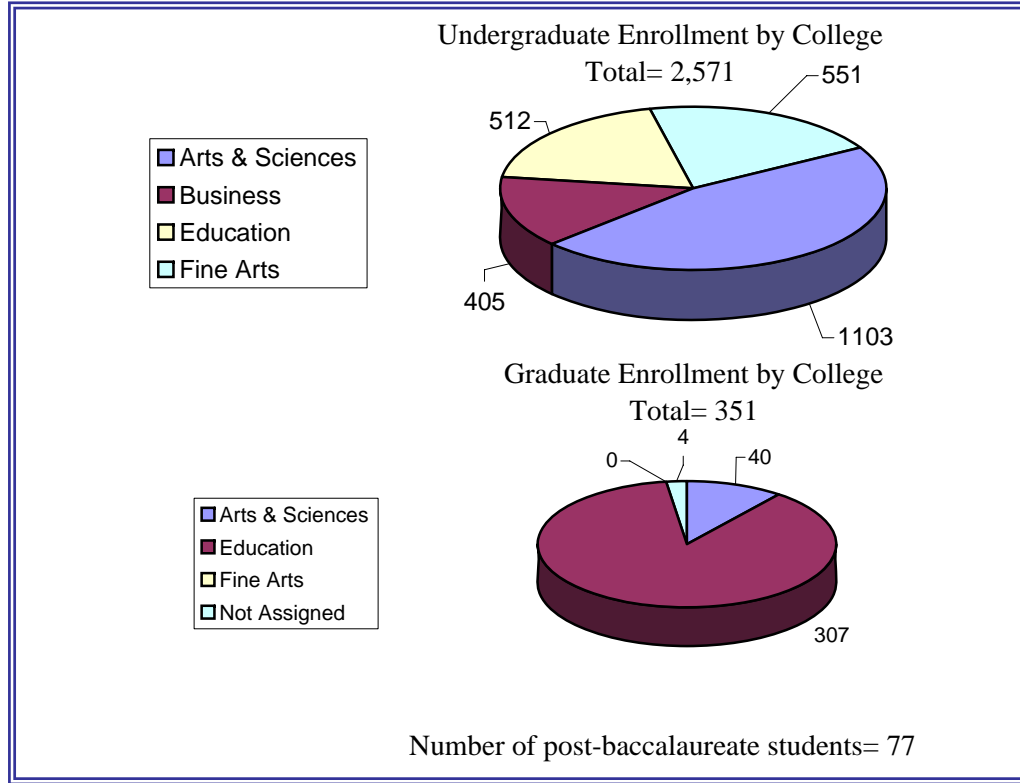

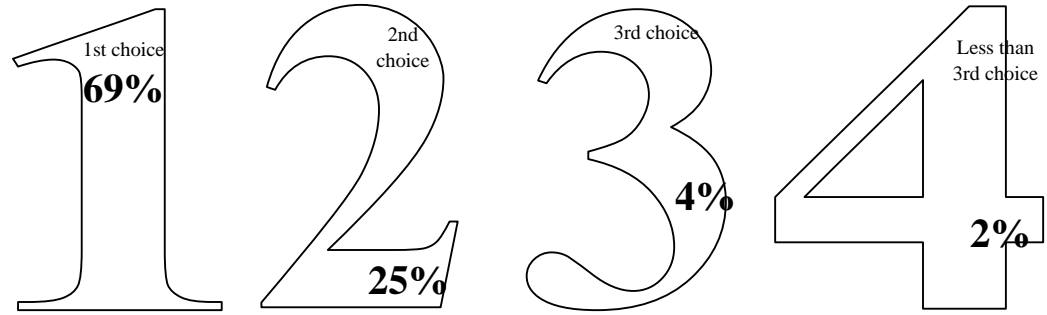

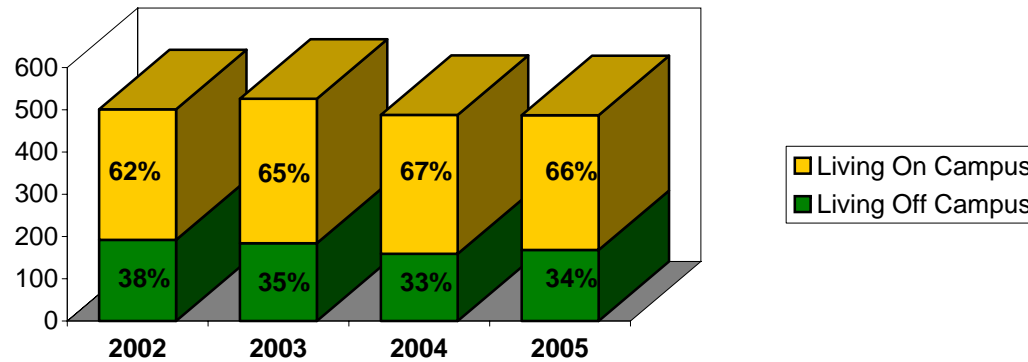

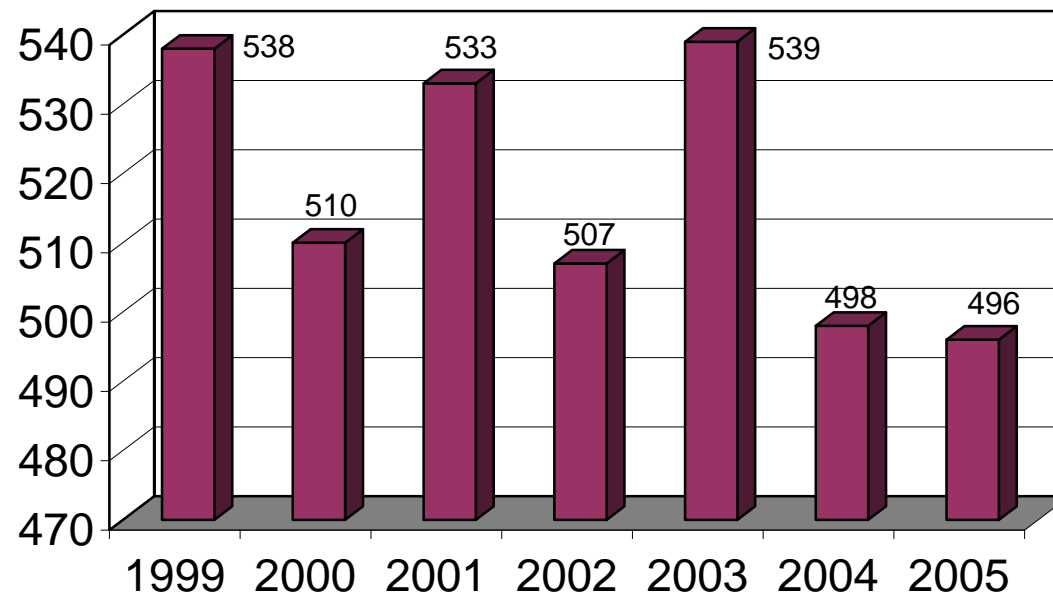

RESIDENCY PROFILE



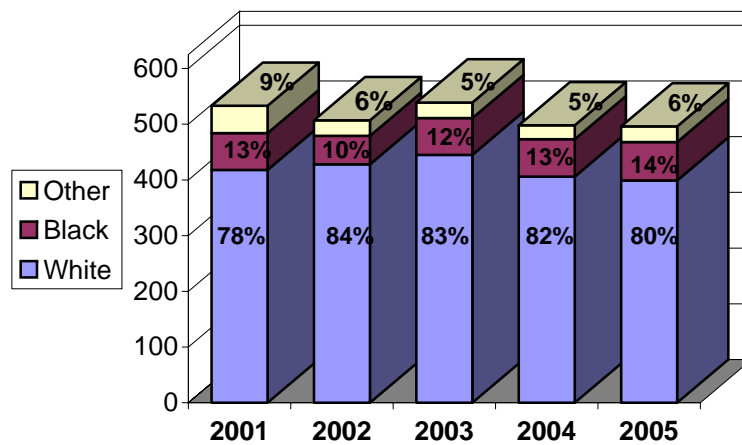
Freshman Class Size

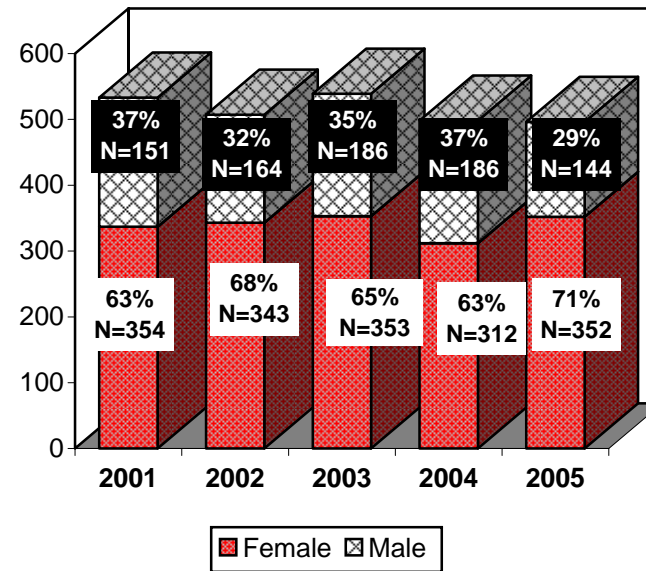


Fall 2005 Freshman Profile

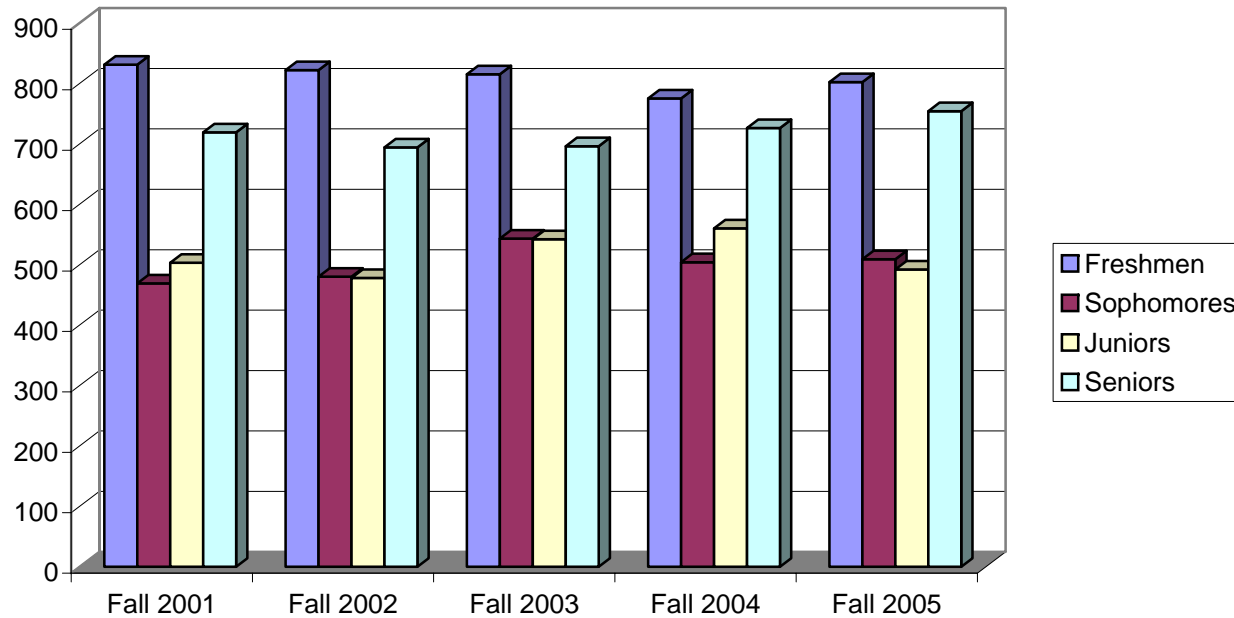
Ethnic Composition

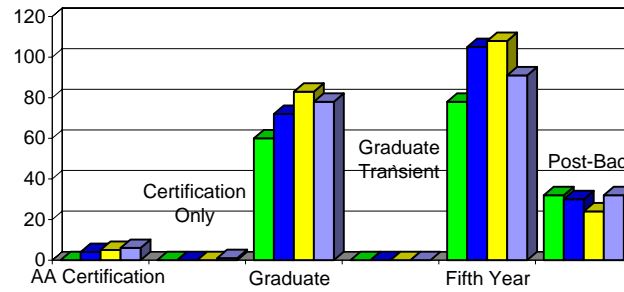

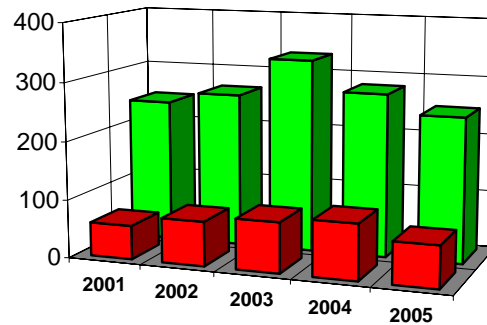
Five Year Comparison

(Degree-Seeking Students)

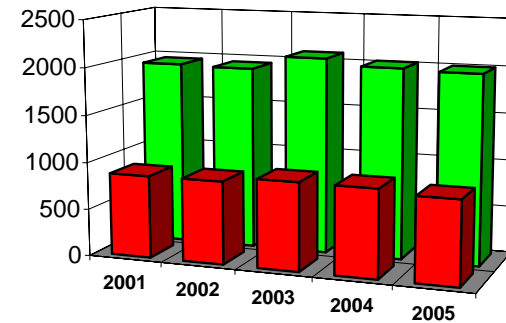

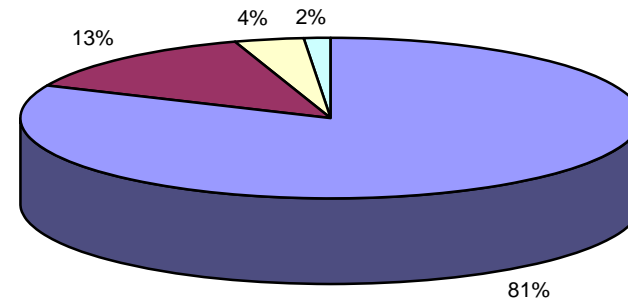

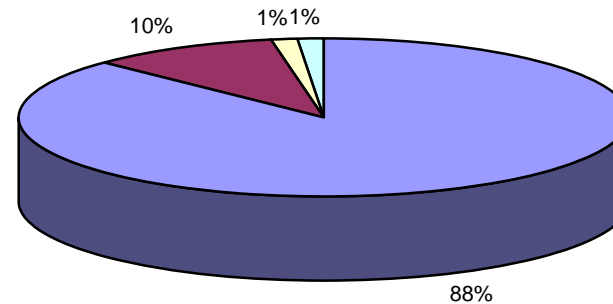
Ethnicity of Undergraduates

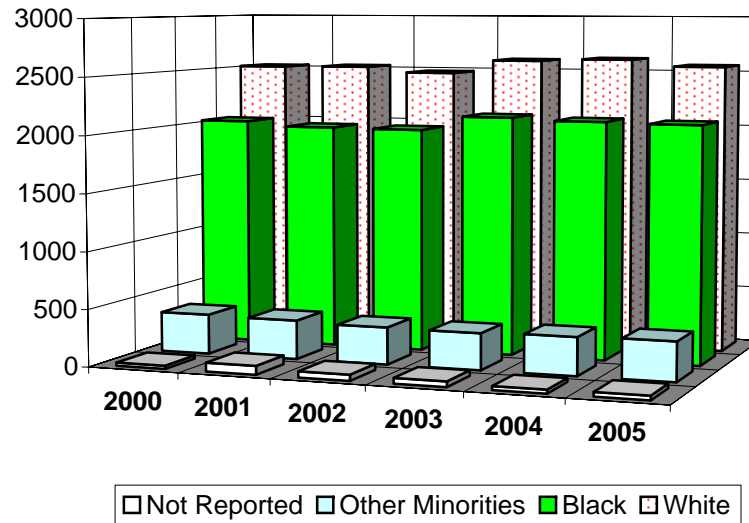

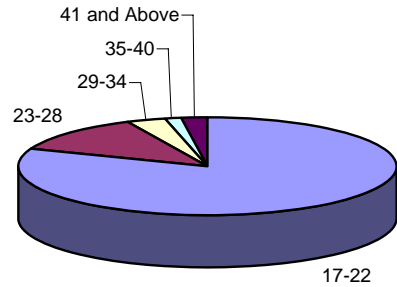

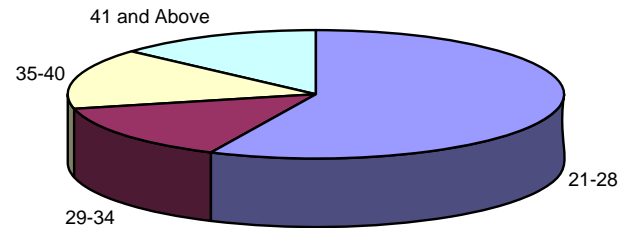

DISTRIBUTION

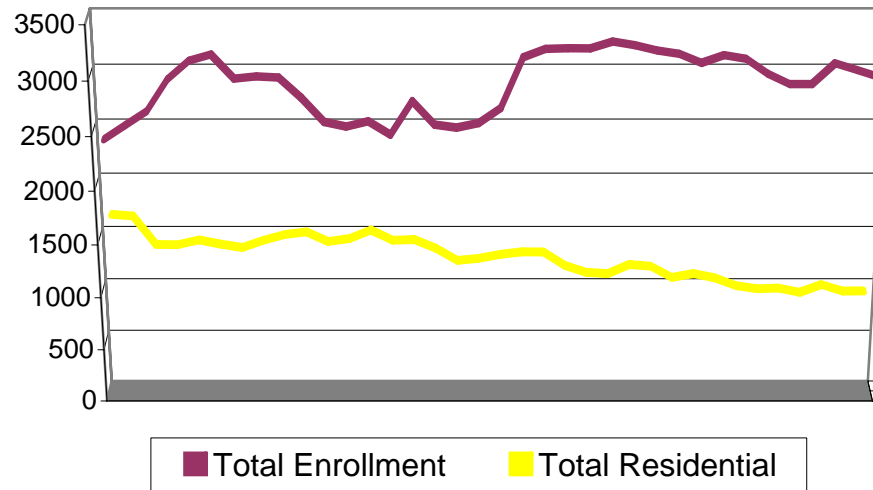

Total Enrollment vs. Total Residential

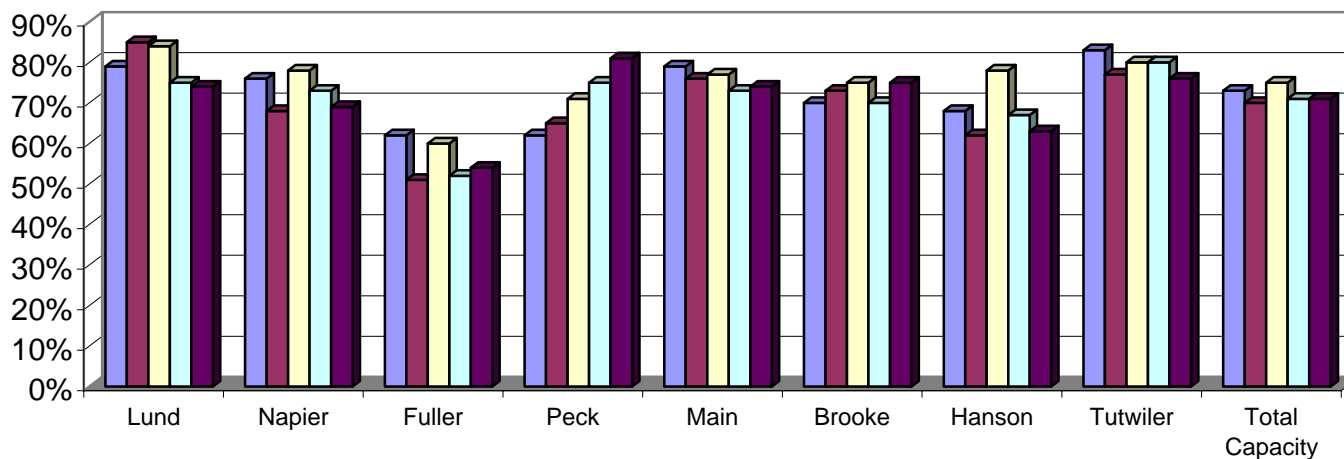

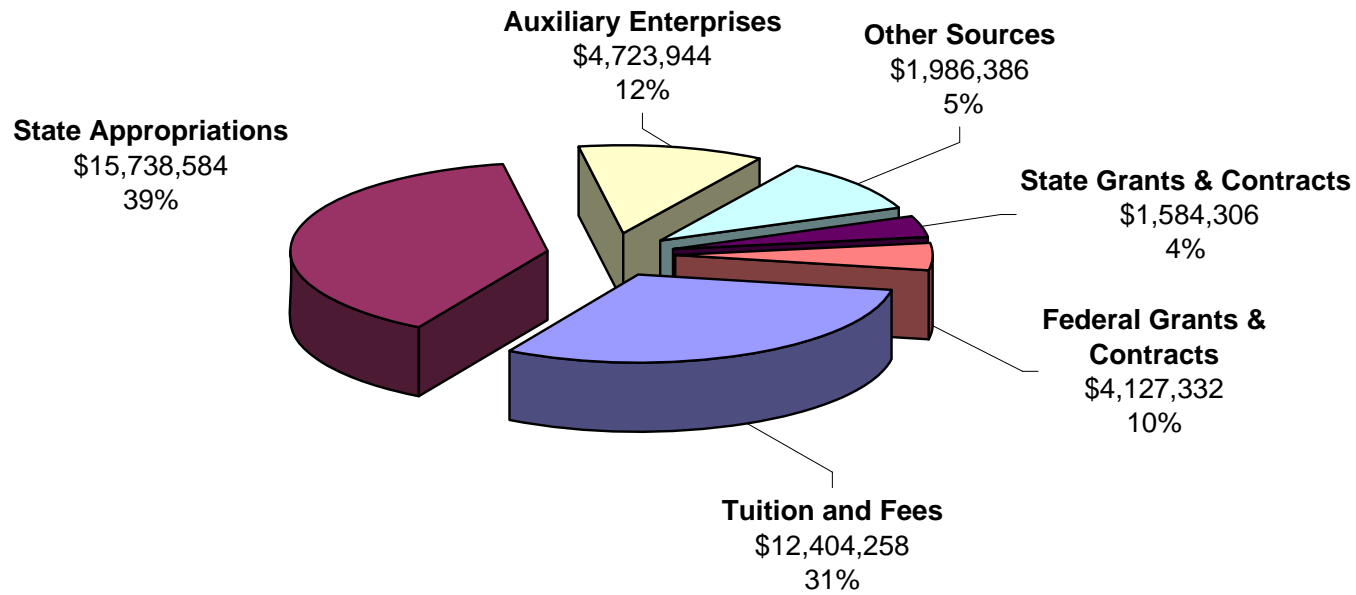
