Dallin Bailey, Ph.D., CCC-SLP is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Communication Disorders at Auburn University. His research involves various aspects of the assessment of and treatment for aphasia and apraxia of speech (AOS). His doctoral studies, advised by Dr. Julie Wambaugh, were completed at the University of Utah, where he focused on developing an aphasia treatment for verbs with low concreteness. His recent publications have investigated stuttering-like disfluencies in individuals with apraxia of speech and outcomes of the Sound Production Treatment for AOS.
