There needs to be more consistent organization/communication between professors before official information is presented to students. There needs to be more clarification of the lesson plan formats between professors so every lesson plans is consistent. The Social studies course needs improvement. I do not feel as though I was at all prepared to teach social studies to students. There was not much organization or the option to learn about different topics in social studies. We basically wrote the same lesson plans on two different topics about 5 or 6 times. In the behavior management class, I think it should be required for all students. I do not think that students that were Collab majors should be exempt from this course. And although I did like the CHAMPS management plan, if that is not what is acceptable at the school we end up teaching at, then we need more strategies and techniques to manage behavior in the classroom.
