You will receive a physical certificate at Honors Day in the Fall.</p> <p>Honors Diploma: Successful completion with an “A” or “B” of 26 hours of any combination of HNRS courses, including the Golson Seminar (HNRS 400) OR the Honors thesis (HNRS 490), while maintaining a 3.2 or above GPA, qualifies you for the Honors Diploma, which will also be noted on your transcript as well as at graduation.
