The effective use of technology is a continuous thread that runs through all initial teacher certification programs in the COEHD. In addition to offering technology classes for teacher candidates, instructional technology content is also embedded in classes throughout programs. For example, candidates in the “Literacy Block” courses learn to use technology tools to present lessons as well as record and analyze student-performance data. As students advance through the program into methods courses, they build upon their ability to use technology as an instructional and assessment tool by creating comprehensive lesson plans that incorporate safe and ethical uses of technology. During the internship semester, candidates use technology to facilitate the collection and analysis of student-performance data (i.e., pre and post test scores). Candidates also incorporate a variety of technology and resources into instruction, use technology to assess student progress, manage records, and, when appropriate, assess students’ technology proficiency.

In Phases 1 and 2 (ED 455/ED 450) candidates learn about “Addressing Student Learning Needs (Planned Supports)” as they write lesson plans. In ED 407 and ED 402, they learn about exceptionalities.

b. Participate as a member of individualized education program teams, as defined in section 614(d)(1)(B) of the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act*.

In ED 402, secondary/P12 candidates learn what IEPs entail, and in ED 407, they look at case studies of students with IEPs. In the Elementary program, the special education process is introduced and evaluated in SPED 407/507.

c. Effectively teach students who are limited English proficient.

Throughout the secondary/P12 program, candidates are expected to create lesson plans and consider planned supports specifically for an EL student. In the elementary program a guest speaker (ESL elementary teacher) Kristen Reed comes each semester to Foundations Block to teach candidates strategies to use in the elementary classroom. Also, Dr. Smajic teaches a full math lesson in Pre-Internship Block completely in Bosnian for students to experience how it feels to be an ESL student trying to learn content.

The special education process is introduced and evaluated in SPED 407. Special education teacher candidates participate in a special education process meeting in SPED 440 and during internship. Elementary and Special Education teacher candidates participate in a mock special education meeting in SPED 415 EDHH candidates receive training on assessments and Assessment Team Reports in SPED 482 and prepare mock IEPs in SPED 490, SPED 476, and SPED 477. They also participate in an IEP meeting during practicum and internship.

c. Effectively teach students who are limited English proficient.

SPED 407/507 provides candidates with a specific instructional module directed toward multicultural and bilingual aspects of special education. Teacher candidates are provided with instruction in providing ESL students with specific accommodations and modifications in the Methods Block and demonstrate their understanding of ESL instructional strategies through lesson preparation in methods block, pre-internship block, and during internship. SPED 490, SPED 205, SPED 300, and SPED 307 provide candidates with a specific instructional module directed toward multicultural and bilingual aspects of special education as it relates specifically to deaf and hard of hearing students. Teacher candidates are provided with instruction in providing students with specific accommodations and modifications in Methods Courses and demonstrate their understanding of bilingual instructional strategies through lesson preparation in methods courses, pre-internship, and internship.
