As students advance through the program into methods courses, they build upon their ability to use technology as an instructional and assessment tool by creating comprehensive lesson plans that incorporate safe and ethical uses of technology. During the internship semester, candidates use technology to facilitate the collection and analysis of student-performance data (i.e., pre and post test scores). Candidates also incorporate a variety of technology and resources into instruction, use technology to assess student progress, manage records,

and, when appropriate, assess students’ technology proficiency.
